

Develop Urgency in Your Ministry

1. Think back over the past four Sunday's. Did you or anyone in your ministry ask a child if they wanted to be part of God's family? YES or NO (circle one)
2. If yes, when, where and how often did this happen?
3. If NO, think of times over the past 4 Sunday's where you could have had this conversation.
4. Have you ever trained leaders to lead a child to Christ? Yes or NO (circle one)
5. Take a 4X6 notecard and a pencil and answer the question, "What does being a Christian mean to me?" (You can only use one side of the notecard.)
6. After you completed this-- fold the notecard in half and on the back answer the same question on half of the notecard.
7. What materials do you have at your fingertips that you could put into a packet that goes home with children after they have made a decision for Christ or have expressed interest?
Some ideas:
 - Letter from you or your teachers
 - Information about your church and services
 - A statement of faith from your church
 - Pamphlet or track that explains what it means to be a Christian.
 - Coupon to your local Christian bookstore for a discount off a Bible for the child.
 - Contact information for you and your Senior Pastor

--A short devotional about salvation

--A little trinket for the child (perhaps something with a cross on it.)

8. Write a single sentence that describes the things you want to accomplish in your ministry.
